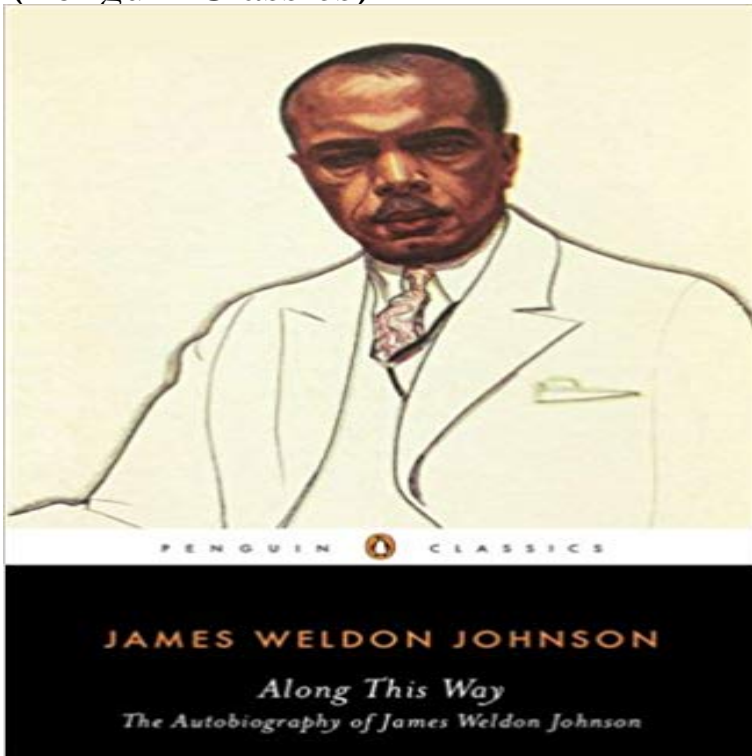


Along This Way: The Autobiography of James Weldon Johnson (Penguin Classics)
