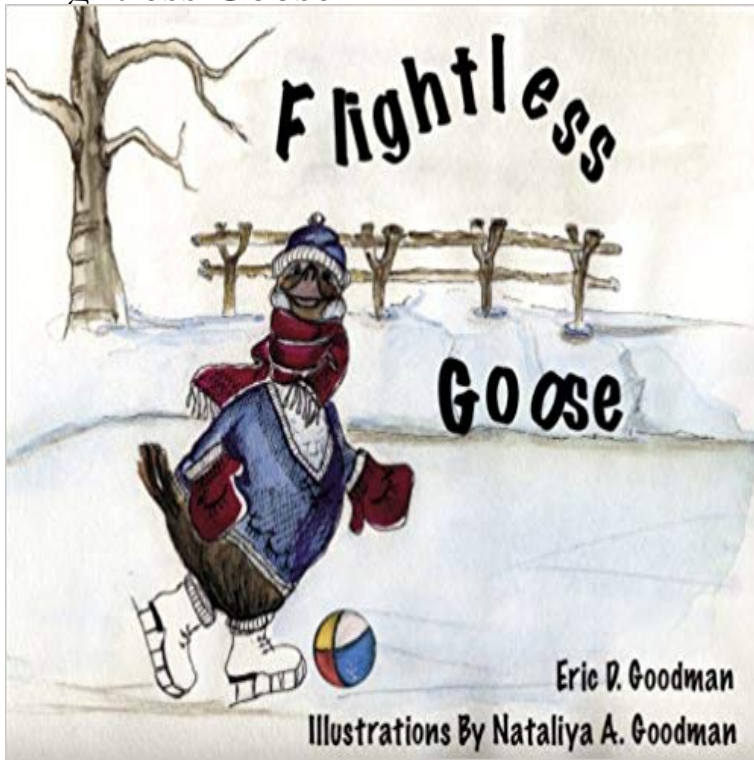


# Flightless Goose
