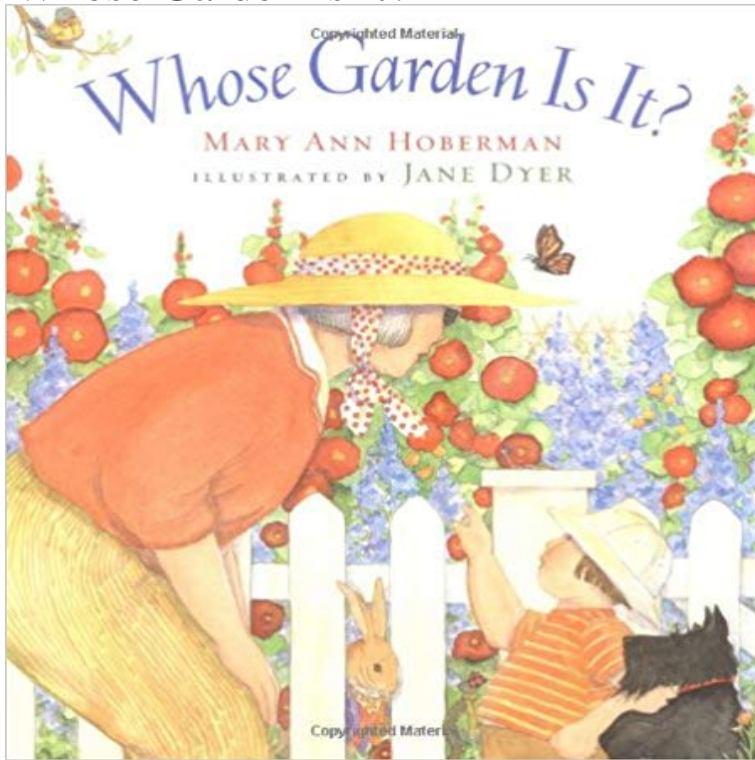


Whose Garden Is It?
